I started teaching in 1979-1980, while still an MA student and assistant to my professor, Heather Sutherland. Since then I have never stopped teaching at an academic level. Nor giving lectures and other contributions in the public sphere. In 1995 I won the Erasmus University Teaching Prize, for being most valued teacher.

My two main academic affiliations so far have been the Free University Amsterdam and – for many years now– the Erasmus University Rotterdam. Over the years I have presented guest lectures in academic institutions in a large number of countries all over the world. At the same time I present lectures for non academic audiences in all kinds of venues, mainly in the Netherlands and Suriname.
